MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Play has psychological and physiological benefits, Lawerence K. Frank, author and lecturer on human growth and development.

For a child, a play is an occasion to drill their capacities in different ways which are pleasurable and self-rewarding. Play is so important for development but unfortunately, forces like child labour, violence and limited resources are taking away their basic Right to Play. Playing is a therapy for optimal child development and growth. Playtime should not be interpreted in a negative impression but as therapy which will bring a balance in the child's life, which will create the highest development allowing them to prepare for the future in respect of academics, social and emotional development.

Since the beginning of The Toy Bank almost 15 years back, I have a strong belief to advocate play and games being educative and hence necessary for children. As I believe that the step I took years ago which involved distribution of my toys to nearby slum areas was a step in the right direction. Indeed a small step, but a necessary one for the larger goal. This one action created ripples which led to a volunteers joining in, collection centers being created across the city and also schools began partnering with us, all of which has led to the growth of The Toy Bank.

The Toy Bank is working extensively in collecting, refurbishing and creating toy libraries all across multiple states in India. We are currently working in 6 states and hoping to expand our project in more states with aim of impacting more children.

Vision: The Toy Bank envisages a society where the underprivileged children have the Right to Play and get their childhood back by actively involving them in educative toys and story books in order to help them gain an active and enriching life.

Mission: To enable every underprivileged child an opportunity to have holistic development through toys, games and story books

To bridge the gap between the privileged and underprivileged children by instilling values of sharing and caring in each child.

WHY TOYS?



Toys, apart from being a source of entertainment, also help in the holistic development of children. Toys help in fostering the mental, social and emotional development of children. A child's brain is well developed by the age of four. Playing games enhances the development of physical and motor skills, and spurs the growth of cognitive abilities and social skills in children. It is in the light of these facts, we believe in Recycling Toys – Recycling Smiles.

Development of Physical Skills: Physical and gross motor skills are developed as a child learns to reach, grasp, crawl, run, climb, and balance. Fine motor skills are developed as children handle small toys.

Development of Cognitive Thinking: Children move on to higher levels of thought as they play with educational toys. Children also learn colours, numbers, sizes, and shapes.

Development of Language Skills: Language develops as a child plays and interacts with other kids. This begins with babies playing cooing games.

Means of Development for Differently-Abled: The aforementioned points also go on to emphasise that engagement in play is beneficial to differently-abled children as well. Indulging in play helps children with Autism, Down Syndrome, Learning Disabilities etc. to develop their skills much faster.

Gender Neutrality through Toys: The Toy Bank also believes in creating gender neutrality through toys. And it is with this vision that Toy Libraries are created. Toy Libraries give children the freedom to choose and play with what they want.

Toys, therefore, play a multi-faceted role in the development of a child. Before the creation of Educative Toy Libraries in the existing project areas, these children hardly had access to toys and therefore hardly had the opportunity to include in different kind of play.



In order to create and sustain Gender Neutral Educative Toy Libraries, the following methodologies are adopted:

Collection

House Hold Collection

We gather used and unused toys through our dropping centres spread across India. These are homes or offices of volunteers who have offered a small place in their premises for collecting toys.

Collection Drives

We periodically carry out collection drives in various private schools, housing complexes and corporate houses.

Refurbishing/Recycling

The collected toys are washed, cleaned, refurbished and/or recycled and given a makeover to make them reusable. The toys are then repackaged into Age Graded Toy Kits.

Creation of Toy Libraries

Once the Toy Kits reach the centres, they are unboxed in front of the children. The Toy Bank as a principal doesn't encourage individual distribution. Instead, the toys are stored in rooms/cupboards of the centres which are referred to as Toy Libraries. Toy Libraries act as safe spaces of play for children. It also gives the children the freedom to play with any toy that they want irrespective of their gender.



Anganwadi Connect

Under the Anganwadi Connect Project, The Toy Bank undertakes the creation of Gender Neutral Educative Toy Libraries across Anganwadis in rural and tribal areas. Anganwadis are focused upon as they connect to the roots of rural child care. Targeting of Anganwadis is done to create an impact on children from a very early age. Toddlers can play with a wider variety of toys, for example, shape sorters are great for toddlers as it teaches them how to match similar items and provide parents with the opportunity to teach them the names of the shape. Lego blocks provide an opportunity to learn more about colours and symmetry while they develop their motor skills.

Creation of Toy Libraries in Bagli, District Dewas, Madhya Pradesh



The Toy Bank created Toy Library for the children of Anganwadis supervised by the Samaj Pragati Sahayog. We impacted around 440 children they are working with. The children are more than delighted to have toys.

The Anganwadi worker witnessed the change in the energy level of children as they want to spend more time in Anganwadi and learn colour name and shapes with the help of toys.

School Connect

In the School Connect Project, we create Gender Neutral Educative Toy Libraries in schools for underprivileged children. Taking into account their age group and/or grade the Toy Kits are created. The prime age for children to start learning about letters, numbers and basic language skills is when they reach preschool. There are a lot of toys that encourage this type of learning, from simple alphabet puzzle to high-tech electronic gadgets. Kids who are in school can supplement their learning with fun and educational toys. Giving them the opportunity to have fun while practising the things they are learning in school will increase their retention of those things.



We have created Toy Libraries for underprivileged children in Delhi

The Toy Bank successfully created Toy Libraries in Chhaya Foundation which is dedicated to the upliftment of underprivileged children.

The centre caters to orphans, street children and children who hail from economically weaker backgrounds. The centre is giving the services on important issues like Education, shelter to old, health to promote social awareness on social evils and environment to create harmony in the community.

Toy Distribution Drive in the slum area of Ghaziabad (U.P.)

We had distributed toys and games among the slum children of the school run by the Ashish Charitable Trust. As these toys will help in nurture the mental, physical and social development of the child.

100 Toys distribution in Delhi

The Toy Bank distributed 100 toys to the less privileged children of Kadim Muslim Kabristan.

These children lead an extremely hard life as they have to supplement their family income by working as ragpickers and are left out to enjoy even the basic privileges that one's life can offer.



Sending Toy Gifts in Lucknow

We have sent amazing toy gifts to children residing in the villages of Uttar Pradesh. Our collaboration with Swatantra Talim Foundation helped us to reach these children and able to give away some amazing gifts.

Rahul, the Secretary, believes that The Toy Bank is a unique idea of collecting toys from the urban areas and disseminating it to the not-so-privileged children providing a fun element in their life along with the concrete learning.





Toys Distribution in Kalyanpuri, Delhi

The toys are donated to less privileged children of Meena Devi Charitable Trust. The toys will help to create an environment which helps in improving their social skills as they interact with other children and learn to share, play and grow.

Toy Libraries are created in the District of Bhuj, Gujarat

The Toy Bank was successfully able to create 8 Toy Libraries in different Villages near the District of Bhuj, Gujarat impacting more than 1000 rural children.

The Toy Libraries are aimed at creating an environment where a child is able to learn different shapes and colours as well as learn the values of sharing and caring and many other which will help in carving an adequate environment for the holistic development of the child.

Toy Library created in Half way Home

The Toy Bank created Toy Library for 50 boys from the age group of 7 to 16 years who belong to lower income families and are in the recovery or prevention phase from substance abuse.

The Toy Library will bring the closure and help the children to regulate their emotions and behaviour.

Toys distribution in Government school of Faridabad, Haryana

Distribution of age-graded toys was done in Government Primary School, Faridabad. The toys are distributed to the children between the age group of 5-10 years. The toys not only brought a big smile on their face but also improved their overall attendance, as they plan and choose one day before that with which toy they want to play.



Creation of Toy Library in Okhla, Delhi

The Toy Bank created Toy Library for the children from the age of 13 to 15 years with YWAM collaboration. These children are living near the street and under the flyover near New Friends Colony. The toys will provide children with an entertainment and aiding in education as they have very limited outlets for the constructive and creative task.

Victoria, Project Manager, told us that the toys we have provided are an invaluable addition in the daily work of the volunteers at the shelter, and a source of joy and excitement to children as well.

Created Toy Libraries in Maharashtra

The Toy Bank successfully created Toy Libraries in rural parts of Maharashtra in collaboration with Thinksharp Foundation impacting around 450 underprivileged children.

Dr Shraddha Bhange from Thinksharp told us that the approach of using a simple "toy" to bring in such a huge change in the life of those children who are in need. Also, I like the way you and your team have kept you work to focus on one thing and are doing your best to fulfill your vision and mission.

Creation of Toy Library in Delhi

The Toy Bank created three Toy Libraries at three different centres of NGO Arpan Seva Sansthan Charitable Trust, one is visually impaired children, second is for girls from Underprivileged communities and third for underprivileged children,

Toy Libraries are created in the shelter home centres where the survivors of sexually abused and trafficked are healing. The play therapy will relieve the emotional distress of sexually abused through a variety of expressive play material and imagination. It will also strengthen the mental health and potential for self-esteem within the child.

Toy library for 100 children in Delhi/NCR

The Toy Bank created Toy Library for underprivileged children coming to Saksham Foundation, Delhi. The library impacted more than 100 children who are involved in rag picking.

The Toy Library provides a platform to the student where they will not only learn the values of sharing but also enhances the mental, physical and social disabilities.



Creation of Toy Libraries in Pune and Mumbai, Maharashtra

In partnership with Teach For India, we created 20 Toy Libraries in collaboration with Teach for India impacting more than 2500 students in Pune and Mumbai.

A Fellow from Teach for India told us that age-graded toys from grade II to X have made an overall development as it acts as a medium of fun and source of learning. Children are always to visit the Toy Libraries in the school as it gives them an opportunity to enjoy while practicing the things they are learning in the school. She thanked The Toy Bank for creating the Toy Library in the schools.

Donating toys in Primary School, Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh

The Toy Bank donated 96 toys to the underprivileged children studying in Shri Shri Bal Vidyalaya, Ghaziabad. Nisha Mittal, Principal wrote to us, "The toys bring immense joy and pleasure as they hardly get such generous and kind gifts. We all thank you with our heart and good wishes."






In our attempt to impact all children, we create Toy Libraries for children with psycho-social and other development & learning disabilities. Specific toys like musical toys, light and sound toys, toys with different textures and surfaces are selected to be curated into Toy Kits.



Creation of Toy Library in children eye hospital in Hyderabad

The Toy bank created Toy Library by donating toys like rattles, cars, soft toys, blocks and puzzles to the children who visit L. V. Prasad Eye Institute, Hyderabad. 50 children were benefited from the toys. The children/ patient were overjoyed at the distribution.





Creation of a Toy Library in Delhi for Children with Autism and other Developmental Disabilities and Underserved Children

At The Toy Bank, we create Toy library for the children with psychosocial disabilities and other developmental disabilities. We partnered with "Orane Kids" school for differently disabled children. The toys not only

served as a source of entertainment but also a play method to learn and explore by themselves, the environment at both home and outside.

Sonia Jaitly, Director wrote to us, "The toys with fine/ gross motor manipulation will without doubt abate the development of the same. Last and most important, the toy play will give way to meaningful leisure, companionship and sharing."

Toy Libraries in Bengaluru

The Toy Bank was able to set up Toy library in Bengaluru with Promise Foundation collaboration. The library aims to impact hundreds of children within the age group of 4 to 17 years.

The age-graded Toy Library aims at creating an environment that helps in the growth of the child. Play-based learning method will allow children to have multiple opportunities to develop and practice their collaboration skills as they participate in a variety of play.


